Learn More About The Capitol:

A National Historic Landmark, the N.C. State Capitol is one of the finest and best preserved examples of the Greek Revival style of architecture in the United States. The Capitol features a domed rotunda and beautiful state Senate and House chambers, meticulously restored to their 1840 appearance. Until 1888, its granite walls housed all of state government and the NC General Assembly met here until 1961.

Become A Capitol Docent:

The Capitol relies on volunteers to assist with the many student and adult groups who tour the building each day. No previous experience is required, just a love of history, enjoyment of working with children and a few hours a month to volunteer. Volunteers receive training, a monthly newsletter, very flexible scheduling, the opportunity for additional training and recognition dinners.
